



## Alameda Corridor-East Project

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### **NEW POMONA FREEWAY (SR-60) RAMPS AT LEMON AVENUE OPEN TO TRAFFIC; BREA CANYON ROAD OFF-RAMP TO PERMANENTLY CLOSE**

**DIAMOND BAR** – After a year and a half of construction completed, two of the three ramps of the State Route 60/Lemon Avenue Interchange Project will open to traffic on the morning of Tuesday, May 1 at approximately 6 a.m.

The three-legged interchange on Lemon Avenue for State Route 60 (SR-60) constructed by the Alameda Corridor-East Project (ACE), in cooperation with Caltrans, County of Los Angeles and the Cities of Diamond Bar and Industry, will consist of a westbound on-ramp, eastbound on-ramp and eastbound off-ramp at Lemon Avenue. The first two ramps to open to traffic include the westbound on-ramp and eastbound off-ramp. Simultaneously, the eastbound off-ramp at Brea Canyon Road will be permanently closed. The eastbound on-ramp at Brea Canyon Road remains open until construction is complete on the eastbound on-ramp at Lemon Avenue, currently scheduled to open to traffic in June.

The Pomona Freeway (SR-60) is a major thoroughfare, serving commuters between Los Angeles, San Bernardino, Riverside and Orange counties. The new freeway ramps at Lemon Avenue will reduce existing traffic congestion and delays, improve mobility and access to and from SR-60 in the Cities of Diamond Bar and Industry, and enhance safety at the SR-60/SR-57 Interchange. The proximity of the Brea Canyon Road ramps to the SR 57/60 Interchange forces vehicle weaving patterns resulting in traffic slowing and collisions. Closing the Brea Canyon Road ramps and opening the Lemon Avenue ramps is a precursor to the construction of the larger SR 57/60 Freeway Confluence Project to resolve the truck traffic and motorist delay choke point where the two freeways converge.

The \$22 million Lemon Avenue Interchange Project was undertaken by ACE in cooperation with Caltrans and the Cities of Diamond Bar and Industry. The project, first proposed in 1968, was funded with a combination of funds provided by the Cities of Diamond Bar and Industry and Metro sales tax measure funds.
